We have determined that Bob Gray was not a member of the 1st Battalion (M), 50th Infantry during our tour in Vietnam.

We currently do not have access to the information that reported him as one of our KIAs, but it was indicated in a note on our original "In Memoriam" pages that someone within our Association identified him as such. We regret the error.

Research indicates that at 10:50 AM, on the morning of June 13th, 1970, Robert Gray was severely wounded by an RPG Round. His back and legs received massive fragmentation wounds. Although evacuated promptly to the 91st Evacuation Hospital, Robert Gray died of his wounds three days later on June 16th.

Bob's name is inscribed on our 50th Infantry Vietnam Memorial in front of Battalion Headquarters, Fort Benning, Georgia. Although listed there in error, by a unanimous vote of our Association Membership, his name will remain on our memorial.

A map of the location of the incident is below:

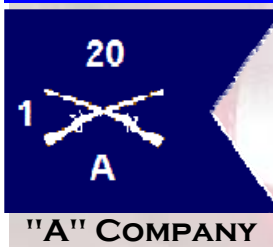

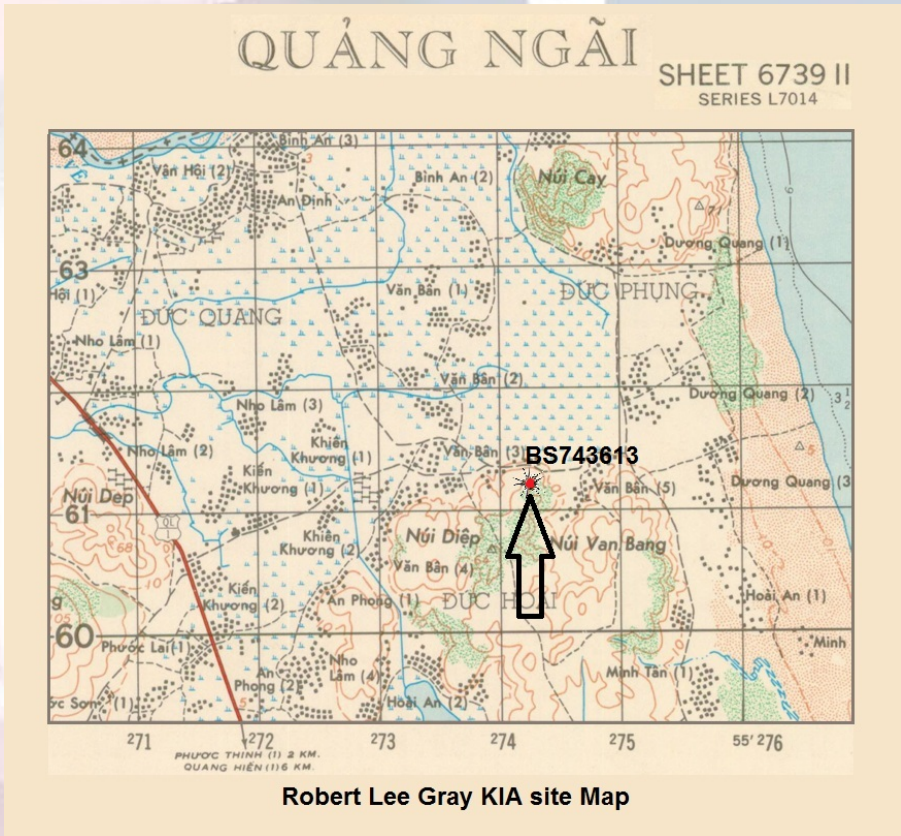
