We have determined that Donald Honeycutt was not a member of the 1st Battalion (M), 50th Infantry during our tour in Vietnam.

We currently do not have access to the information that reported him as one of our KIAs, but it was indicated in a note on our original "In Memoriam" pages that someone within our Association identified him as such. It is believed that Honeycutt was wounded in action WSW of An Khe on May 8th...and died of his wounds on May 11th. Also killed in that may 8th action were Eckhard Brenker and Gary Canapp. 6 others were wounded.

Currently, no photo exists for this man.
