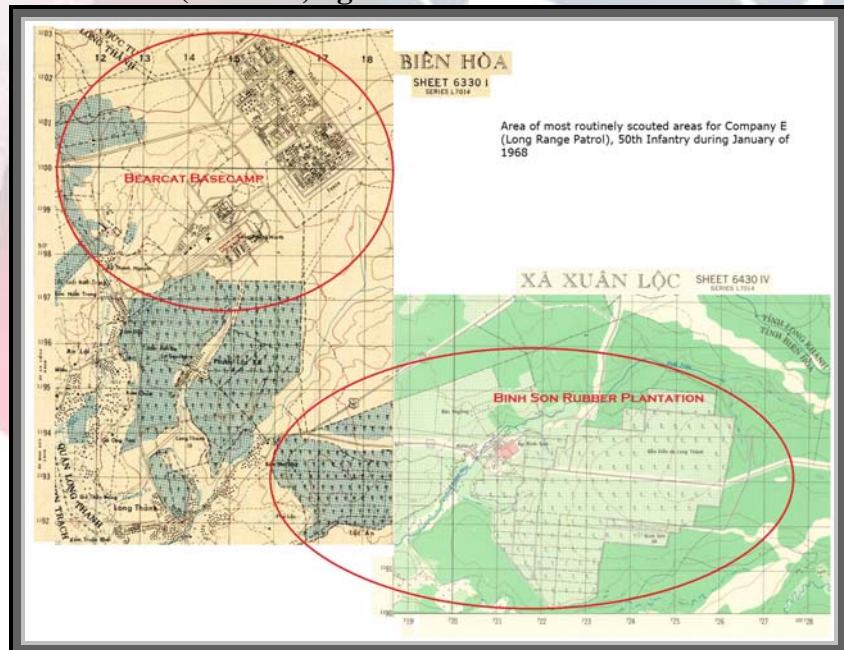

PFC George House belonged to the elite Company E, 50th Infantry Long Range Patrol unit of the 9th Infantry Division, operating out of the Bear Cat base camp in early 1968.

Details of the death of PFC Hodge are minimal at present. Documentation uncovered so far only indicates that he was killed by enemy rocket or mortar fire when his basecamp was attacked.

Patrols were concentrated in Bien Hoa province and the unit was routinely scouting the Binh Son Rubber plantation and provided area reconnaissance coverage to monitor movements of the 5th Viet Cong Division.

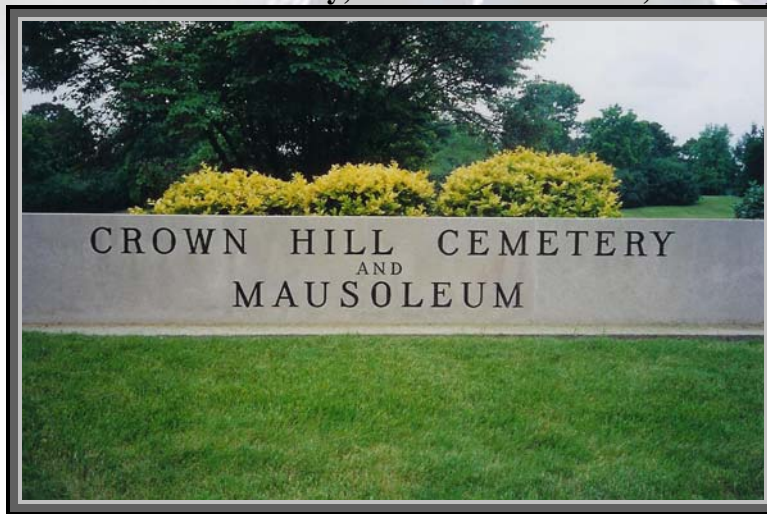
The two major Infantry Divisions in the Saigon Area were the 9th Infantry and 25th Infantry Divisions during the Tet offensive, which was all but ended on February 11th. Both these divisions reported that on the date of House's death, enemy forces were attempting to avoid contact due to extremely heavy losses and that their offensive actions, for the most part, were limited to increased stand-off attacks by indirect fire (Mortars) against U.S. installations.



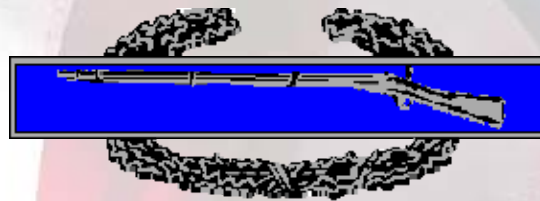
