Robert Kazmierczak was killed on June 14th while His Platoon from our Charlie Company was working with "D" Company of the 4th Battalion (Airborne), 503rd Infantry. The Daily Staff Journal for the 173rd Airborne Brigade stated:

1303 Hours: "D" Company, 4/503, at coordinates BS 913097, Heard an explosion to their south. They sent out a patrol and found a VC Female with multiple fragmentation wounds to both of her legs. Part of the patrol was escorting her to a medivac helicopter and part of the patrol was searching the area when a booby trapped 105mm Artillery Shell was set off, killing Kazmierczak instantly and wounding 1 other soldier.


Luciano Garza, a member of Kazmierczak's squad remembered: "Kaz" was the APC Driver for my squad. I can't remember which platoon, but we were in "C" Company and working with a rifle platoon from the 173rd. He and a man from the 173rd tripped the booby trap and he was killed. I remember he was scheduled to go on R&R to Hawaii in a few weeks and was excited about getting married while there."
