Specialist Four Ronald Mall died as a result of a truck accident at Camp Baxter. He was severely wounded in the accident and died 12 days later at a hospital at Clark Air Force Base in the Philippines.

"E" Security, 50th Infantry was a rifle security company in DaNang East, based in Camp Baxter, assigned to USA-SUPCOM DaNang, reporting to the Provost Marshall (Major Butz). His Commanding Officer was CPT Buder. His unit supplied security for the Marble Mountain P.D.O. Yard, a P.O.L. Dump, Camp Adenir, a Philco-Ford installation, Deep Water Pier, the China Beach P.X., a reefer yard, a beer & soda yard, Freedom Hill R&R Center, and other facilities in the DaNang Vicinity of Quang Nam Province.

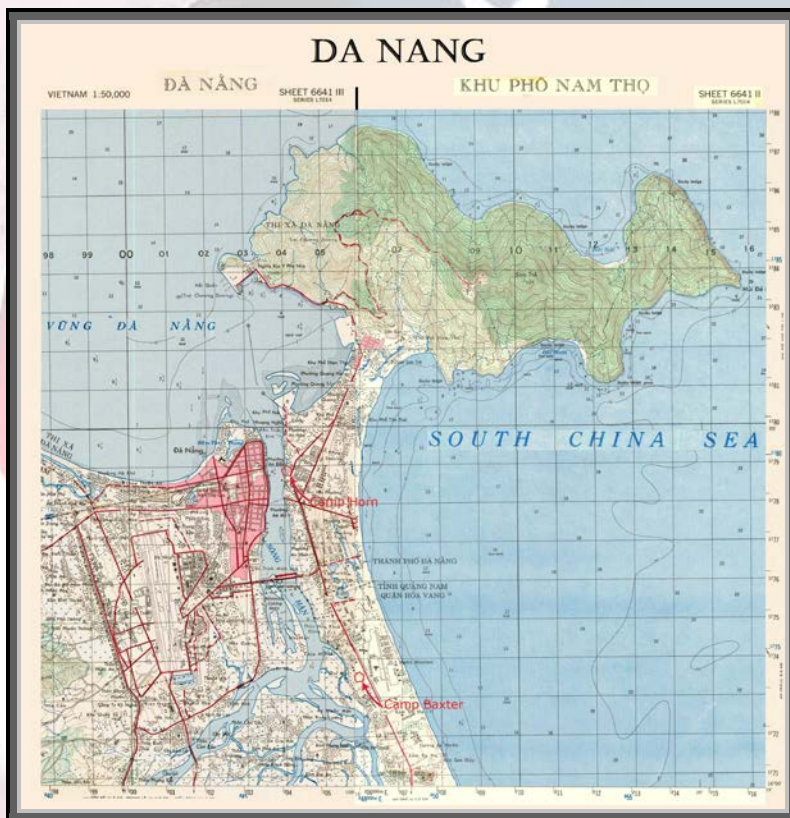

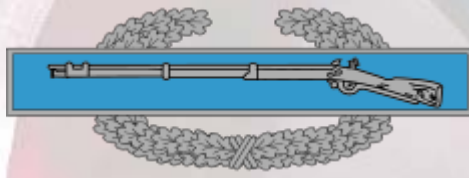
