SGT Travis "Tex" Matlock was killed In Action on June 12, 1969, near the Southwest corner of Lake Dam Tra O, south of Bong Son in Binh Dinh Province (See map below). The Battalion History for the period stated:


"At 1130 hours, an Armored Personnel Carrier (APC) from "A" Company hit a mine, suspected to have been a booby trapped 175mm Artillery shell at BR958799. One U.S. Soldier was KIA and 5 wounded (One of which later died of his wounds).

Ten minutes later, "A" Company's second platoon, moving to the area of the blast, was ambushed at BR950815 by 7 or 8 VC/NVA with Small Arms Fire. There were no casualties and the platoon picked up 3 Male detainees, ages 50, 30 and 19 (They had no weapons)."



Also killed in the blast was Corporal Lorenzo Pettis, also of "A" Company and the Short Range Ambush Platoon.




William Matlock is buried at Sunset Memorial Park, 5127 North Street, Nacogdoches, Nacogdoches County, Texas (Photos Below)

THROUGH HIS UNTIRING EFFORTS AND PROFESSIONAL ABILITY, HE CONSISTENTLY OBTAINED OUTSTANDING RESULTS. HE WAS QUICK TO GRASP THE IMPLICATIONS OF NEW PROBLEMS WITH WHICH HE WAS FACED AS A RESULT OF THE EVER-CHANGING SITUATIONS INHERENT IN THE COUNTERINSURGENCY OPERATION AND TO FIND WAYS AND MEANS TO SOLVE THOSE PROBLEMS. THE ENERGETIC APPLICATION OF THIS EXTENSIVE KNOWLEDGE HAS MATERIALLY CONTRIBUTED TO THE EFFORTS OF THE UNITED STATES MISSION TO THE REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM TO ASSIST THAT COUNTRY IN RIDDING ITSELF OF THE COMMUNIST THREAT TO ITS FREEDOM. SERGEANT MATLOCK'S INITIATIVE, ZEAL, SOUND JUDGMENT AND DEVOTION TO DUTY WERE IN THE HIGHEST TRADITION OF THE UNITED STATES ARMY AND REFLECTED GREAT CREDIT ON HIM AND ON THE MILITARY SERVICE.
