

PFC Ricky Null was killed while "B" Company was on a search and destroy mission on the coastal central highlands in the Bong Song Plains. Although the Battalion History for the period neglected to note the exact location, we know it was in the vicinity of our Base Camp at LZ Uplift. Details were reported as follows: "At 10:40 AM, a man from "B" Company stepped on a land mine, killing him and wounding two others.

**PFC** Null was awarded the Bronze Star for Meritorious Service as well as the Purple Heart, Posthumously.

PFC Ricky Lee Null is buried at Gettysburg National Cemetery Annex, Section E23, 97 Taneytown Road, Gettysburg, Adams County, Pennsylvania. The photos below were taken by Historian Jim Sheppard at Gettysburg National Cemetery.

5 MAY 1968

For distinguishing himself by outstanding meritorious service in connection with ground operations against a hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam during the period From March, 1968, to April, 1968.
