Tim Robson was killed when enemy elements attacked his night ambush location with grenades and small arms fire. Killed with Robson was Tom Barth of Boston, MA. A third man was wounded and another man suffered severe shock. A patrol was sent out to reinforce the team...but found that the enemy had withdrawn.

A map of the location of the attack on Tom Barth and Tim Robson in Binh Dinh Province is shown below:



Tim Robson was selected to be "Soldier of the Month" of the 173rd Airborne Brigade representing the 1st Bn (Mechanized), 50th Infantry for the month of February, 1969. His certificate for exemplary conduct and performance of duty is shown below.

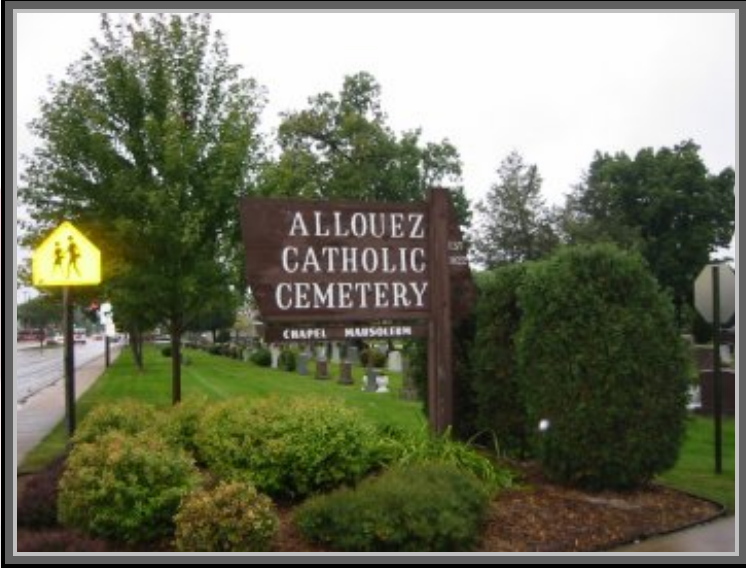

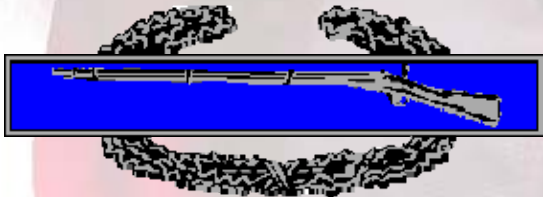
