Charlie received several distinguished honors including the Purple Heart, Air Medal, and Army Commendation Medal. He cherished the lifelong friendships he formed during his service.

Following his service, he explored various careers before earning an Associate in Applied Science Degree and Certificate in Drafting Technology from Amarillo College. He went on to build a successful career in electrical design and drafting, combining his artistic talent with technical skill.

Charlie was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, brother, and friend. 
