## Everett Daniel "Dan" Odom, Jr

Dan Odom, Jr., 72, of Valdosta, died on Saturday, June 9, 2018 at South Georgia Medical Center following a brief illness.

Everett Daniel Odom, Jr. was born in Valdosta on September 1, 1945 to the late Everett Daniel, Sr., and Rebecca Eugenia Caldwell Odom. He was a veteran of the United States Army and served during Vietnam as a medic with the 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion (Mechanized), 50<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment attached to the 1st Cavalry Division (Airmobile) and the 173rd Airborne Brigade.
