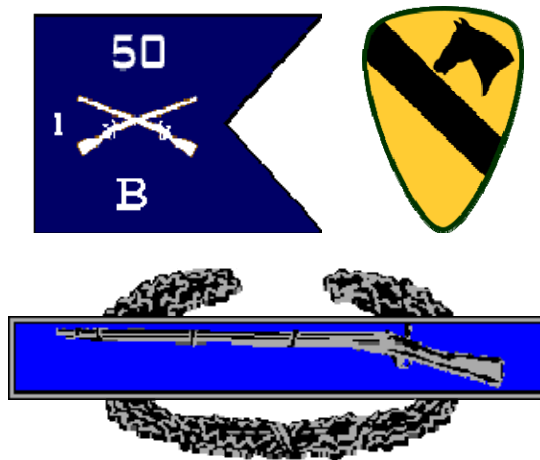




50TH INFANTRY REGIMENT

Robert T. Taylor, 70, of Iuka, Mississippi, died Friday, May 2, 2014, at the Magnolia Regional Health Center in Corinth. Mr. Taylor was born January 28, 1944, in Colbert County, Alabama. He was a U. S. Army combat veteran of the Vietnam War where he served with Bravo Company, 1st Battalion (Mechanized), 50th Infantry, 1st Cavalry Division (Airmobile) and was severely wounded at the Battle of Tam Quan on December 10th, 1967. He received the Combat Infantryman Badge, the Purple Heart, the National Defense Service Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal, and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal.



He was a Life Member of the D.A.V., and loved antique cars. Visitation is scheduled for 5:00 until 9:00 p.m., Monday, May 5, at Cutshall Funeral Home in Iuka.
