

Winter vacations would include trips to Mexico and the Dominion Republic. Mel loved his grandchildren and enjoyed following their activities and held a special place in his heart for his faithful dog "Ellie". He was a hardworking, caring man with passion for family and community service. Mel was active in the American Legion Post #266, the Douglas County Farm Bureau and gave decades of service on the Bennington Planning Board. Most recently, he was serving as treasurer of the Farm Bureau and Vice Commander of the Legion and chairman of the new Veteran's Memorial Bennington. Mel was a simple man who enjoyed a steak and potato dinner, RFD-TV and reruns of Gunsmoke. Mel will be remembered as a kind, soft-hearted Christian man who was fair and honest. Mel has enjoyed the last 9 years with his fiancée and travel partner, Deann Zens.
