

Obituary for Walter "Wally" Wroblewski


Walter "Wally" Wroblewski, age 66, passed away on Tuesday, December 9, 2014. He was born on November 16, 1948 in Kent City, Michigan to Stanley and Josephine (Goldyn) Wroblewski. He lived in Bitely and attended Baldwin High School where he graduated in 1966. Wally served in the US Army and saw combat as an infantryman with the 3rd Platoon of Charlie Company, 1st Battalion (Mechanized), 50th Infantry. He earned his Combat Infantry Badge while his unit was attached to the 1st Cavalry Division in Vietnam. He was awarded the Bronze Star, the Air Medal and 2 Purple Hearts for wounds received in combat and reached the rank of Sergeant. Wally was a life member of the 1st Battalion, 50th Infantry Association.



When he returned to Bitely after the war, he married Janice Bradford in 1971. They had one son, Jason. Wally was a US Mail Carrier for 30 years as well as being a volunteer firefighter with Lilley Township Station 17 for over 45 years. He was also active with the Boy Scouts and was a scout leader. Wally loved hunting and fishing and enjoyed Native American history. He spent much time fashioning arrowheads using Native American Indian techniques. Mostly, Wally loved his family; his loving wife, Jan, and always enjoyed children. His nieces and nephews would tell you that he was the "greatest uncle ever"!

Wally leaves to cherish his memory his mother, Josephine, his wife Janice Wroblewski, his son Jason (Lera) Wroblewski of San Angelo, TX, 3 grandchildren, Casey, Haley and Alina, sisters Audrey (Gordon) Lyons, Diane Wanroy, Anna (Jim) Barnett, Mary (Charles) Barron, 3 brothers, Edwin (Amea), John (Darlene) and Jeff (Madalyn) along with a host of nieces and nephews.
