# HERBERT EUGENE RANDALL SEPTEMBER 22, 1943 – FEBRUARY 14, 2019

Herbert Randall, loving husband, father of two children, and grandfather of one granddaughter passed away Thursday, February 14, 2019 at the age of 75. He was born and raised in Northeast Oklahoma (Miami and Commerce).

His two earned titles, Colonel and Doctor, encapsulate his life's work. He served 31 years and seven months in the U.S. Army and rose from Private to Colonel. He served in Vietnam as an Infantry Company Commander (Captain) with Charlie Company, 1st Battalion (Mechanized), 50th Infantry Regiment, 1ST Cavalry Division (Airmobile). He was awarded the Silver Star, the Army's third highest medal for bravery, two Bronze Stars, a Purple Heart, and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry, among others.

While serving in Germany, he met the love of his life – Maria Engelhardt. At the time of Herb's passing, they had been married for over 55 years.

Upon retiring from the military and earning his doctorate in Education (University of Southern California), he worked at the state level in Hawai'i. He moved to Nevada in 1999 and volunteered at several nonprofit organizations...serving right up to the time of his cancer diagnosis. Herb served selflessly on the Nevada Silver Haired Legislative Forum for over 9 years including 5 years as President, National Chair of the Silver

Haired Congress and founder of the Nevada Senior Citizen of the Year award program. His passion was writing as evidenced by the articles (approx. 80) he wrote for the Senior Connections Magazine from 2012 to 2018.

He was preceded in death by his daughter, Kim, and siblings Mary Power, Norma Rohmiller, Janie Gattenby, Alan (Pete) Randall, George Randall, Elmer Randall, Alice Faye and Rossie.

He is survived by his loving wife of 55 years, Maria; his son Mike; daughter-in-law Teri; granddaughter Caitlyn; and his sister Frances Fox.

### **GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING**

1/50TH ASSOCIATION REUNION, MAY 3, 2017



- The meeting was called to order by President Jim Segars at 0938.
- Invocation was given by Chaplain Toby Jordan.
- President Segars led the membership in the recitation of the Pledge of Alliance.

### **MINUTES OF 2015 MEETING OF THE ASSOCIATION**

Secretary Gary Quint was recognized. Secretary Quint recommended that the minutes of the 2015 meeting be accepted as published in the April 2017 Newsletter. A motion was made to accept and it was seconded and a voice vote unanimously passed the motion.

Gary Quint also recognized the generous donation of Tom and Diana Clark which reduced the cost of attendance by half.

#### TREASURY REPORT

The Treasury Report was given, by Treasurer Chuck McAleer, with a projected revenue for the 2019 reunion of \$22,000.

A motion was made to accept the Treasury Report and it was seconded. A unanimous voice vote accepted the repot as given.

Treasurer McAleer thanked all of the reunion organizers as well as Loretta Segars who works diligently to generate revenue for the Association. Treasurer McAleer brought to the attention of the membership that *Life Time Memberships* of \$150.00 will, over time, reduce the revenue of the Association. The creation of *Friends of the Association* to increase revenue was proposed as a possible solution. A motion to amend the bylaws to allow this was made by John Topper. The motion was seconded and carried.

Treasurer McAleer then recognized all Medics in attendance and introduced Mr. Ron Fischer. Mr. Fischer authored a book on a conscientious objector who served as a Medic. PRC Erwin Bruce Sims was among those of the 1/50th Battalion who was deployed January 1968. PFC Sims was a conscientious objector who was killed March 2, 1968. He did not carry a weapon and was killed while attempting to administer aid to a wounded comrade. Mr. Fischer emphasized that heroism was not unique among Medics.

#### **ASSOCIATION HISTORIAN**

Historian Jim Sheppard was recognized and stated that he has accumulated volumes of material including World War I, World War II and Viet Nam. The World War I and World War II material will be donated to the Battalion Archives. Mr. Sheppard also stated that he found nine KIA families who will attend the Memorial Service.

#### **ASSOCIATION NEWSLETTER**

Lorene Burch, Editor of the Association Newsletter, was recognized and stated that she appreciated receiving material from anyone and that information no matter how large or small would be accepted. Although articles would be critiqued, the contents would be printed in their entirety.

Mrs. Burch urged that we check the Association Website for the Newsletter if at all possible to save postal costs.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

John Topper was recognized to address new business.

Col. Topper discussed the revision on the event schedule, most importantly, that the Turning Blue Ceremony was not open to our members this year due to rain.

Shirts and Caps handed out at registration will be worn to the Memorial Service on 5/4/2017 and the Graduation on 5/5/2017. All members are to ride the same bus both going to the post as well as coming back to the hotels.

Col. Topper announced that SMA Daniel A. Dailey will speak at the Memorial Services. SMA Dailey is actively in working with Congress on behalf of soldiers who have been discharged. Lt. Col. Carson, Commanding Officer of 1st Battalion 29th Infantry will speak specialized training techniques at the lunch with the Battalion on 5/4/2017.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

There was no Old Business presented.

#### **GENERAL DISCUSSION**

Randy Smith was recognized and discussed where the reunion would be held in 2019. A motion was made to have the next Reunion held at fort Benning in 2019. It was seconded and carried.

#### **ROSTER OF OFFICERS**

A motion was then made to vote for a new roster of Officers for the Association. A vote was opened to those in attendance to nominate a preferred candidate. There were no nominations; therefore, a motion was made to those in attendance, for the current roster of Officers to be retained. The motion was seconded and carried.
