I had hoped to be able to make another research trip to the National Archives, but that is still in the planning stages. I plan to "pull" records from the 67th and 85th Evacuation Hospitals...specifically their General Orders....and copy all orders of 50th Infantry men who received awards while in the care of these combat hospital facilities. These will be mostly Purple Hearts, but will add to our text records archives...and, in some cases, will clear up some date questions concerning some actions and firefights. There was some discussion with Historian Tom Kjos, who is still working on a manuscript detailing the Battle of Tam Quan, about joining him and his fellow 1/12th Cavalry comrades for a research endeavor...but that has not yet materialized. I may make a visit alone after the holidays and after my reunion mailings have been completed in January. As usual, I will be inviting all on our extensive list of KIA families and friends to attend our memorial wreathe laying ceremony. We generally have about 20 of these honored guests in attendance.

I hope everyone has an enjoyable holiday season & continued good health and happiness in 2019!






Association of the 1st Battalion, 50th Infantry Historian/Website Report for December of 2018 Jim Sheppard, Charlie Company, 1965-1968

Hello All!

When this December Newsletter is distributed next month...we will be just 5 short months from our next gathering at Fort Benning, Georgia. I am sure there will be more details within this newsletter as to registrations and reservations for the event.



I also wanted to mention that my expertise is not necessarily specific to the 50th Infantry. Since becoming your historian in 1999, I have "morphed" into much more than a document gatherer and archivist...and am now recognized as a Vietnam Historian in many circles. My experiences in Vietnam not only included 9 months with the 50th Infantry in the Central Highlands, but also 6 months in III Corps Tactical Zone (Mostly Saigon, Bien Hoa and Long Binh) as well as 3 months in IV Corps with the 9th Infantry Division "Mobile Riverine Force" (HHC, 3rd Battalion, 47th Infantry). Those experiences enabled me to have an advantage over many historians as I witnessed the war on multiple levels. 15 Years ago I began to assemble a personal library of Vietnam reference books and non-fiction novels/memoirs...which has grown to over 500 volumes. I now have extensive reference material on every imaginable event and for every day of the U.S. involvement in Vietnam from 1945 through current day Vietnam. I bring this to your attention only to suggest that if anyone has a question about anything relating to Vietnam, and not simply the 50th Infantry, please do not hesitate to inquire. I would be happy to assist.

In September, I attended a lecture by Dr Eric Villard at the Army Heritage and Education Center in Carlisle, PA. Dr Villard is a noted Vietnam Historian and recently published the 1st Edition of Combat Operations, "Staying the Course" – October 1967 to September 1968. His book is the latest in the series on Vietnam by the US Army Center of Military History. (If you are considering buying a copy, I would advise waiting until the 2nd edition is published as there will be substantial corrections)

I had been invited by Eric after some collaboration regarding facts about our battalion in Vietnam in 1968 and he decided to use our battle at An Bao as one of three major examples of action in Vietnam during what became the Phase Two of the 1968 Tet offensive...or "Mini Tet", during May and June of 1968. His lecture discussed the history of Westmoreland's plans in Vietnam which were uncovered during extensive research of unpublished materials....and how the events of 1967 and 1968 in Vietnam led to our contact at An Bao. I was honored to be invited to attend a dinner before the lecture attended by Dr Villard and several other key members of the Heritage Center which was funded by an endowment from the Omar Bradley Foundation.

During Dr. Villard's lecture, he called me to the dais to give a brief "insider" talk on our involvement in the battle. The entire lecture will be available on You Tube soon and I will post a link on our website message board for all to view and enjoy when the video is available. I am humbled by the privilege to represent our Regiment at these Vietnam history events and bring attention to so many heroic efforts by the 50th Infantry Regiment in Vietnam a half century ago.
