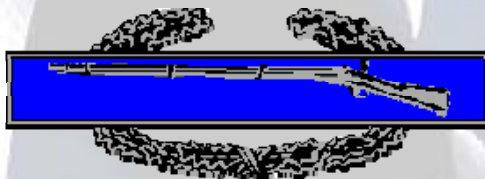




## 1ST BATTALION (MECHANIZED), 50TH INFANTRY

Andrew J Soltis, Jr., age 56, of Perrysburg Township, passed away on Tuesday, June 15, 2004, at St. Vincent Mercy Medical Center after a courageous battle with cancer. Andy spent his life as a hero and died in the same respect. He was born on February 7, 1948, to Andrew J. Sr. and Helen (Kovacs) in Toledo. He was a graduate of Macomber High School and then continued his education at Bowling Green State University where he received a bachelors Degree in Business Administration. Andy proudly served his country in the US Army from 1968 to 1970. In 1969 he spent time in Vietnam and was awarded the Purple Heart as well as an Army Commendation
